Great Zeal and Industry

Happy 19th of June. What a fantastic celebration we enjoyed! We had the delight of seeing a living pageant representing the struggle and the victory for the New Church that this day involves. We begin this article by expressing our gratitude to Justine and Jared Buss for presenting us with a powerful and moving worship service. What a special day to help remember and celebrate the Lord starting a fresh process, a new day in the Life of His Church!

Think about what this precious event means. We commemorate it yearly, reflecting on what the Lord accomplished once the “work was finished.” What was finished was the publication of the *True Christian Religion*. The “work” was more than a published book; it was all that was accomplished by means of the Lord bringing the heavens, the hells, the world of spirits, and the church back into order. The “work” of the Second Coming of the Lord is show to us this both in the book of Revelation as well as the whole of the New Evangel, culminating in TCR.

When we think about the literal story of June 19th, and reflect on pictures drawn or pageants reenacted to depict this event, what comes to mind? Twelve men who hundreds of years earlier had been found, called by Jesus, are again called, reassembled, and reassigned. They are now all angels (TCR 4). We assume even Judas Iscariot was among them, as we are told these were the “disciples who followed Him in the world” (TCR 791) And they are sent to preach the New Gospel.

They went everywhere. Think about that! From the highest heavens to the lowest hells and all the places in the world of spirits. These preachers each went forth, each to a particular region most suited to receive their particular kind of preaching (TCR 108). They went to “preach the gospel anew.”

How did they do it? Two particular words are mentioned: zeal and industry.

In other places in the Word, working and preaching with zeal and industry are mentioned together, referring to those especially who love the Lord by means of the uses of their occupations and employments. No wonder we often hear newcomers to the church say they were attracted by means of seeing how people in the New Church live their lives with spiritual dedication and purpose. The 12 disciples went about their new assignment on June 19th with a zeal and alacrity that they had never before experienced.

We too are daily called and sent to be the best disciple of the New Church in the particular spheres of responsibility and influence in which we find ourselves. Each of us is unique; the 12 disciples stand for the whole complex of the Lord’s teachings, which we hold in mind from our lifelong study of His Word. Each disciple, upon going out, returns as an apostle, meaning that it is applying what we know to the way we live that solidifies and affirms the head and the hands of our spiritual beings. Our unique, particular reception and application of the Lord’s life in us calls to us and sends us forth to particular spiritual uses that may be

different from that of our brother, sister, parent, or child. The Lord has a role and place for us in His church, and in spreading His church, unlike any one else.

We celebrate the new gospel. The story of June 19th also reminds us that, though each of us is different, we are also each called to be unified, called to “marriage supper of the lamb.” The Lord wishes to “gather us together” (TCR 791e) to His church.

The story is not over; it is ongoing. Interiorly, June 19th is the quintessential spiritual spring of angelic life. It is no mistake that this day is just before the longest day of the year, reminding us of the fact that in Heaven, and in our internals, it is eternally spring. There are shorter and shorter evening states of darkness as we approach His celebration in our regeneration journey.

Though our annual celebration of this event has come and gone, our spiritual celebration must become a daily event. It arises in our hearts as we begin each day asking the Lord what we can do to serve Him. Pray that the Lord may inspire you with a spirit of zeal and industry for the development of His church within you and around you.
