The Open Door

~The introduction to the New Church Day pageant performed at Olivet Church on June 16, 2019~

Today, we're celebrating the birth of the Lord's New Church—the birth of a new spiritual communion that He has created. One of the many things we celebrate about this church is its teaching that the Lord wants every human being in heaven. His desire and His intention is to save every soul. Churches and religions sometimes seem better at closing doors than at opening them, but that's not what He wants. How could our Heavenly Father close doors against His children?

There are barriers that stand between us and heaven. There are barriers in our minds, when we don't see the truth, or when we don't understand. And there are barriers in our hearts, when we resist the Lord—when we say deep within ourselves that we want something other than heaven. But our God is working patiently, tenderly, and tirelessly to open a way for us. And that, among so many other things, is what we celebrate in today's pageant.

The scenes from the pageant are taken from the book of Revelation, which uses symbolism to describe the Lord's Second Coming and the establishment of the New Church. In the pageant you'll see the Lord reaching out to different churches, which represent different kinds of people. His words to them are different, because they are different, but what He wishes for them is the same. You'll see the Lord opening a scroll, which represents the opening of the Word and the restoration of our ability to see the truth. You'll see four horsemen, which represent progressively worse and worse understandings of the truth and the gradual encroachment of falsities that darken heaven in our minds. The Lord opens His Word to lead us out of this darkness. You'll see two great signs: a woman who represents the true church, a church that is radiant with love; and a dragon, which represents the hungers and the lies that undo everything the Lord is doing. And you'll see a holy city, which represents the church that the Lord is building.

It is to this holy city that He calls us. In that city—in His church and in His heaven—He, the Lord, is King and Saviour. The door He strives to open to us is a door that leads to Him. "Come unto Me, all you who labour and are heavy laden," He says (Matthew 11:28). There are things we cannot bring with us into His city. Things that cause hurt must be left behind. There are places in our hearts and minds that are closed against Him. No one can truthfully claim to follow Him perfectly. But He loves us all the same. Where the door is shut, He stands at the door and knocks. Where the door is open, He promises that no one will close it against us. He wills that we come to Him—every last one of us. "Yes," He says, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore with mercy I have drawn you" (Jeremiah 31:3). "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out" (John 6:37).

From the Principal




2019 Olivet School Valedictorian Speech
