## Let Not Your Heart Be Troubled

The world is offering us a lot of reasons to be anxious right now. There is, of course, a lingering pandemic—and as we navigate the reopening of schools in Ontario, many people are watching closely to see whether or not the pandemic gets worse. There are other troubling things going on in the world, including storms, fires, and social and political tensions. There's no shortage of fuel for our anxieties—and the truth is, there probably never will be.

When the Lord, in His Word, talks about our anxiety, His tone suggests that He knows very well that we see many reasons to be anxious. In *Luke*, He says, "And do not seek what you should eat or what you should drink, nor have an anxious mind. For all these things the nations of the world seek after, and your Father knows that you need these things. But seek the kingdom of God, and all these things shall be added to you" (12:29-31). He knows that the nations of the world are anxious. He sees and understands the things that trouble us. He gets it. That's one of the most important and most powerful implications of worshipping a God who is Divinely Human: He is able to look into our faces and understand us. He has been tempted. He has felt anxiety. Our Father knows what we need.

He never indicates that our anxieties mean that something in us is broken. On the contrary, He seems to say that it is inevitable that we will, at times, be anxious. "In the world you will have tribulation," He says (John 16:33). He knows what we are, and He knows what we're made of. Anxiety is fundamentally about the loss of control: it's the fear that we may not or probably won't be able to secure something that we see as important. To us, the fact that things are out of our control sometimes comes as a revelation; but the Lord has always known that a great deal of life—most of it, in fact—will be beyond our control. "For He knows our frame; He remembers that we are dust" (Psalm 103:14).

Some degree of anxiety is inevitable. In this world we will have tribulation. The Lord is not displeased with us when we look at the world and recognize the truth—that it's out of control! That is, it is out of our control. The moment in which we recognize that is never an easy moment; it's like expecting a step that isn't there when you're going up a staircase in the dark. God knows that we will have moments like that; God knows we will find ourselves overwhelmed. And His hope has always been that when we miss a step and stumble—when we're afraid—we will look up. When it hits us in the face that life is utterly out of our control, that's our moment in which to remember that virtually none of what goes on around us was ever meant to be under our control. We are responsible for our choices—for the spirits that we make homes for within our bodies. The rest is in God's hands. And none of it slips through His fingers.

Lift up your eyes on high, and see who has created these things, Who brings out their host by number; He calls them all by name, By the greatness of His might and the strength of His power; not one is missing. (Isaiah 40:26)

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. (John 14:27)

Hopefully, the stricter laws and fines will get people's attention to take social distancing more seriously and we will avoid the higher hospitalizations we saw in April and May during the first wave.

But the fact remains that we are in the region of the highest concentration of COVID outbreaks in Canada, and although other congregations are having some in-person worship services and meetings, we in Toronto are remaining cautious. Better safe than sorry.

It is with sadness that we report that we have suddenly lost our long-time friend Bob Delyea. The family would like to have a memorial service when things ease up more and can allow a large gathering to take place. We will keep Olivet members and friends informed with a One Call notice when details are worked out.

Other than that, we look forward to "seeing" you online. We will have a Wednesday doctrinal class this month as well as starting up Zoom in Arcana and continuing with the Wednesday discussion groups. Of course, Sunday services are livestreamed and archived to be available to watch at a later time if you missed the Sunday service.

Please stay healthy and safe as we enter into the cooler months of autumn and find ourselves indoors more often. Please don't hesitate to give Jared or me a call if you wish to chat about little things or big things. And do keep us aware of people you know who could use some pastoral care or attention.
